Angry at being scolded by neighbours

Delhi man kills their 11-year-old son

A 11-year-old boy who was reported missing two weeks ago was murdered by his neighbour because the man was angry at being scolded by the child's parents, police said on Sunday.

The 28-year-old suspect, Danish, led the police to the decomposed body under the Khajuri Khas flyover after CCTV footage showed him walking with the boy around the same time that he had gone missing, said Atul Kumar, deputy commissioner of police (north-east).

The DCP, however, said they were still questioning the suspect to know whether there was any other motive behind the crime or if the boy had been sexually assaulted. "For now, we only have Danish's version of the events. We will know more once we receive the autopsy report," said the DCP.



Identified by the police only by his first name, Danish earned his living by selling chicken. He lived in the same neighbourhood as the boy in north-east Delhi's Nehru Vihar. Until recently, he shared a friendly relationship with the boy who lived with his parents. The boy's parents are daily wage labourers. "Danish had also gifted the boy a few chicks to rear. They would often spend time together," said the DCP.

But for the past few days,

he was being repeatedly scolded by the boy's parents. "Danish would sit outside the home of the boy whose parents believed that he was blocking the narrow street," said the officer based on Danish's "confession". "Danish was angry. Finally he decided that killing the boy would leave his family in pain."

On May 14, Danish allegedly took the boy along with him to an isolated spot under the Khajuri Khas flyover, almost four

kilometres from their own neighbourhood. "The boy would often go out with him, so it wasn't difficult to lure him away. They walked to the spot," said the officer.

Danish then strangled the boy and dumped his body in a "cavity" in the ground under the flyover even as the child's family got a missing case registered at Khajuri Khas police station.

"Our investigators scanned many hours of videos and saw thousands of people before the CCTV

camera installed outside a shop showed the boy in Danish's company. We picked up Danish on Saturday and confronted him with the footage. He couldn't explain the boy's disappearance and confessed," said the officer. Thereafter, Danish led the police team to the body, said the DCP. "Though Danish told us that he had strangled the boy, we would be able to confirm that only after the autopsy because the body was in a highly decomposed condition," said the DCP.

Ultrasound centres not inspected since January 2018

Delhi's health department has not inspected any ultrasound centre between January 2018 and February 2019, to check for violations of the Pre Conception-Pre Natal Diagnostics Technology Act (PC-PNDT), as per the reply to an RTI query. As per the reply, 16 and 18 inspections were done by the state team in 2016 and 2017, respectively, while the last time there was no inspection was in 2009.

"There is a shortage of manpower. The office does not have sufficient officers to conduct the inspections," a senior official with the Delhi government's health department said.

In comparison, 16 cases under the PC-PNDT Act were registered in neighbouring Gurugram in 2018, which



led to 30 arrests and three in 2019, which led to six arrests.

India's child sex ratio (0-6 years) fell from 927 girls/1,000 boys in 2001 to 919 girls/1,000 boys in 2011, according to the Census data. Delhi's child sex ratio is below the national average, at 871 girls/1,000 boys.

"We constantly receive tip-offs and information about sex determination clinics and illegal abortion centres from locals, most of who are pharmacists selling abortion pills. We gather information and the resources, and act on it as and when the situation is appropriate," said Amandeep

Chauhan, Gurugram district drug control officer and a member of the PNDT committee.

The PC-PNDT Act was enacted in 1994 to prevent sex-selective abortions. Under the PC-PNDT Act, hospitals, nursing homes, and diagnostic centres are forbidden from using ultrasound to determine and communicate the sex of the unborn child to the parents. Breaking the law can lead up to three years of imprisonment and a fine of 10,000. For subsequent offences, the prison term may extend to five years and the fine, up to 10 lakh.

Action against clinics performing illegal sex determination improved Delhi's sex ratio from 902 girls/1,000 boys in 2016 to 913 girls/1,000 boys in 2017.

Since then, inspections reached a five-year low, to zero,

in 2018. Inspections are done to check for irregularities, such as not filling out 'Form F' that records the medical history of pregnant women seeking ultrasounds, or for not registering ultrasound machines, as mandated by the law. The number of inspections shot up to 19 in 2014, after hovering between one and six since 2009. "It is good to see that the sex ratio in Delhi is improving, but with the lax implementation of the law, we are unlikely to see any more improvement, if not a decline. And, look at it this way — even if we go by

the current sex ratio, still 4% of the 3.5 lakh children are being lost. For every illegal termination, three medical crimes are happening — two ultrasounds, to check the gender and then the abortion. The state authorities have to be active to prevent this," said Sabu George, an activist who has been working to prevent female foeticide for three decades. In February, the Delhi government approved a reward scheme, wherein an informer will receive 50,000 for a successful raid and pregnant women acting as decoy customers.

Delhi's power demand up by 22% in April-May

The power demand in the national capital has been soaring this year with April-May recording a 22-per cent growth over the corresponding period in 2018. The peak power demand in April 2018 was 5,200 MW. This year, the demand in April



crossed the 5,200-MW mark five times, peaking at 5,664 MW on April 30, said Delhi's power department and discom officials. "Notwithstanding the intermittent pleasant weather, Delhi's power demand in 2019 is turning out to be up to 22 per cent more than the corresponding period last year," an official said. The power demand in April 2019 has been higher on 19 occasions than the corresponding days last year. On April 22, it was 3,828 MW in 2018 and 4,588 MW in 2019 - an increase of 20 per cent. Again on April 25, it was 4,438 MW in 2018 and 5,552 MW in 2019 - an increase of 19 per cent, the officials said. The trend continues in May 2019. Of the first 24 days of May 2019, the power demand has been higher than on 13 corresponding days of last May, increasing by up to 22 per cent on May 10, 2019, when it touched 5,985 MW as against 4,899 MW on May 10, 2018, they said. However, the power demand between May 15 and 24, 2019, has been marginally less than the power demand on the corresponding days last year as temperatures remained relatively pleasant because of the western disturbances, they pointed.

The public works department (PWD) has been beautifying the city roads and open spaces in an effort to cut down on dust pollution in the national capital.

Around two months ago, the PWD began with the roads around ISBT Kashmere Gate Ring Road, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, Deen Dayal Upadhyay Marg among others by planting of variety of saplings on the central and side verges.

The department is also beautifying other open spaces such as small parks or patches of lands alongside the roads managed by it. The PWD manages 1,260 km roads in the city. It is planting ornamental and seasonal flowering plants, creepers, shrubs and grass alongside

Surat aftermath: Fire dept seeks number of students enrolled in coaching centres

Two days after a fire at a coaching institute in Gujarat's Surat claimed 22 lives, the Delhi Fire Service (DFS) has asked coaching institute owners across the city to provide latest buildings plans and made it mandatory to mention the number of students enrolled in each centre.

The fire department, along with the municipalities, will inspect over 5,000 coaching institutes in the city. Along with reviewing the permission, the officials will assess the "assembling capacity" of the buildings.

"In several of the private coaching centres, hundreds of students are admitted. The classrooms and the coaching centre buildings are rarely equipped to safely manage the crowds in case of fire accidents," said a senior fire official.

For instance, in East Delhi's Laxmi Nagar several coaching institutes are lined one after another along the main road whose exits



generally open into narrow bylanes. Although at least 60 students attend these classes in a single batch, most buildings do not have an alternative exit point for evacuation in case of fire, the official said.

"One batch has 60 students but when the exams are close, we conduct joint sessions for batches. Close to 100 students attend our test sessions at a time," said a caretaker of a coaching centre.

Similar scenes can be seen around North Delhi's Pitampura and South Delhi's Munirka.

Chief fire officer Atul Garg said inspection of buildings and their permits have already begun. "We are conducting inspections and any building owner found ignoring the safety norms will face action,"

he said. Garg also said that inspection reports will be sent to municipalities to take action against erring owners.

Senior officials of the building department of East Delhi Municipal Corporation said that many owners of these centres have not registered their buildings as an 'assembly building', to excuse themselves of the routine inspections. "We will conduct surprise inspections. The problem is that many do not seek permissions and we are not the agency responsible to grant fire clearances," a senior EDMC official said.
